

We've both grown up in Namibia and carry a deep love for this land, its wildlife, and its people.



The Land.

Sandveld is the starting point of every hunt.

From here, we operate across carefully selected hunting areas, chosen for their wildlife quality, conservation standards and long-term sustainability. Sandveld is located in northeastern Namibia, within the western reaches of the Kalahari ecosystem. Sandveld Lodge lies in this region, bordering two communal wildlife conservancies: the NꞛA-Jaqna Conservancy in Bushmanland and the Otjituuo Conservancy in Hereroland.

Our approach allows us to hunt responsibly and without pressure, guided by seasons, quotas and natural animal movement.

All plains game hunting takes place within the Sandveld and Onjama areas, where open savannah and Kalahari bushland provide ideal conditions for ethical, fair-chase hunting.

For specialized species, we operate in two distinct regions beyond Sandveld: the Waterberg Plateau and the Caprivi. Accessed from our Sandveld base, these areas reflect Namibia's diversity — from open Kalahari landscapes to elevated plateaus and river-bound wilderness.

Sandveld & Onjama

Sandveld and Onjama are managed together and form the core of our operation. Covering approximately 97,000 acres, this area is dedicated to plains game hunting. Open savannah, Kalahari bushland, natural waterholes and long sightlines define the terrain. Hunting here is shaped by patience, observation and an understanding of animal movement rather than speed or volume.

Waterberg Plateau

Located in the Otjiwarongo area, approximately three hours from Windhoek, Sandveld Safaris holds the sole hunting concession within the Waterberg Plateau National Park, secured in 2025. This highly protected conservation area is known for regular sightings of black and white rhino and is widely regarded as one of Africa's most prestigious destinations for Cape buffalo hunting.

The concession spans approximately 100,000 acres on top of the Waterberg Plateau and is home to wild, free-range Cape buffalo with exceptional genetics. Hunters have the opportunity to pursue outstanding bulls, with realistic expectations of 42 inches and above. Hunting at Waterberg demands true bush hunting — locating fresh tracks and following them on foot through dense, rugged terrain.

Caprivi

Caprivi represents Namibia at its wildest. Shaped by rivers, floodplains and dense vegetation, the region offers opportunities to hunt buffalo, elephant, hippopotamus, crocodile and selected plains game.

Conditions vary between areas and require experience and adaptability. Cape buffalo trophy expectations typically range between 35 and 38 inches, reflecting the region's genetics and environment.





The People of the Land

San Bushman Trackers

The San Bushman are an integral part of life and hunting at Sandveld. For generations, this land has been their home. Their knowledge of the Kalahari is not learned from books or technology, but from a lifelong relationship with the environment around them. Tracks, broken grass, displaced sand and subtle changes in vegetation tell a story that is often invisible to others.

At Sandveld, the San Bushman trackers lead the tracking in the field. They read animal movement, identify age and direction, and help determine whether a trail is worth following. Their skill allows hunts to unfold naturally, guided by understanding rather than chance.

Working with the San Bushman is not about recreating tradition for display. It is about recognising expertise that remains essential today. Their role is practical, respected and fundamental to how we hunt responsibly. For our guests, hunting alongside the San Bushman offers a deeper understanding of the land — not as spectators, but as participants in a process built on experience, patience and respect.

The Hunt

Hunting at Sandveld begins early in the morning after a hearty hunter's breakfast. From the lodge, guests head out in specially equipped vehicles to check overnight activity at selected water points and begin reading the signs in the veld.

Bushman trackers lead the stalk, interpreting tracks in the sand and subtle changes in the savannah vegetation with remarkable precision. Their tracking skills, rooted in one of the world's oldest continuous hunting cultures, are central to the Sandveld experience.

Kudu, eland, oryx, wildebeest and zebra are among the primary species hunted at Sandveld, alongside impala, springbuck, warthog and a wide range of other plains game. Hunts are never forced and unfold according to conditions and what the bush provides.

Hunting typically continues through mid-morning and resumes again in the late afternoon as temperatures cool and animals become active. During the heat of the day, guests return to the lodge for lunch, rest and preparation for the evening hunt. Sandveld offers a selection of quality firearms in calibres ranging from .222 to .458, all fitted with Zeiss optics. Bow hunting is also available, with no import permit required for bows in Namibia.

After an animal has been harvested, the Sandveld team assists with retrieval and field preparation. Trophies are carefully handled, and the meat is used at the lodge and shared with the local community.



Plains Game


Plains game hunting forms the core of the Sandveld experience. It is where most hunts begin, and for many guests, where the strongest memories are made.

Hunting takes place within the Sandveld and Onjama areas, a vast stretch of open savannah and Kalahari bushland shaped by seasonal change, natural water sources and free-moving wildlife. The terrain allows for fair-chase hunting on foot, guided by tracking, observation and patience rather than fixed setups or artificial pressure.

A typical day is spent walking the land, reading sign and adapting to conditions as they unfold. Wind, light, distance and animal behaviour determine each decision in the field. Success is never rushed and never guaranteed — and

that is precisely what defines the experience. The diversity of plains game at Sandveld reflects the health of the land itself. Species commonly hunted include:


Buffalo

Cape buffalo hunting at Sandveld is offered in two distinct regions, each defined by very different terrain and conditions.

At the Waterberg Plateau, buffalo hunting takes place in a highland environment with dense vegetation and limited access. The area is known for exceptional, large-bodied bulls, with trophy expectations typically ranging from 42 to 50 inches.

In the Caprivi, buffalo hunting unfolds in a river-based wilderness shaped by floodplains and thick cover. Trophy expectations here typically range between 35 and 38 inches, reflecting the region's genetics and environment.

All buffalo hunts are strictly quota-based and planned with careful consideration of season, conditions and conservation requirements.




Namibia is recognised internationally for its progressive approach to wildlife conservation. It was one of the first countries in the world to incorporate environmental protection into its constitution, and today almost twenty percent of its land is protected through national parks and conservancies.

At Sandveld, conservation is not a statement — it is a responsibility that guides daily decisions. Wildlife is managed through regulated quotas, seasonal planning and long-term monitoring. Hunting is conducted as part of this system, contributing directly to habitat protection and sustainable land use.

Beyond wildlife management, Sandveld works closely with local communities, supporting livelihoods and maintaining traditional knowledge that remains essential to conservation efforts. The success of conservation depends on balance. Protecting wildlife means understanding the land, respecting its limits and acting with restraint.





Big Game

Cape buffalo • Elephant
Hippo • Crocodile
Leopard • Cheetah

Big game hunting at Sandveld is offered in the Caprivi region as well as at the Waterberg Plateau, where Sandveld holds the exclusive hunting rights.

Opportunities exist to hunt selected species, including Cape buffalo, elephant, hippopotamus and crocodile, while leopard and cheetah are hunted in designated areas under specific quotas and conditions, all in accordance with Namibian conservation regulations.

Each hunt is carefully planned and conducted with a strong focus on safety, experience and respect for the animal and its environment.

Bow Hunting



Bow hunting at Sandveld is well established and carefully integrated into our hunting areas. The terrain, wildlife movement and waterhole systems provide suitable conditions for ethical bow hunting throughout the dry season.

Hunts are conducted from a combination of natural blinds, ground blinds and selected tree stands. Typical shot distances range between 25 and 30 yards, depending on setup and conditions. A practice range is available near the lodge, allowing equipment to be checked and adjusted before the hunt. Fixed broadhead tips are recommended.

Bow hunting is legal in Namibia, and no import permit is required for archery equipment.

The Lodge

The Heart of Sandveld

The lodge is the centre of life at Sandveld. It is where each day begins and ends.

Built in a classic African safari style, the lodge is open, practical and welcoming. It is a place to plan the day ahead, return from the field, and spend the evening reflecting on the hunt. In the mornings and at dusk, wildlife often moves close to the lodge, drawn by nearby water sources.

The lodge sets the rhythm — calm, unhurried and grounded.

Meals at Sandveld are simple, honest and shaped by the day's hunt. Game meat is carefully prepared and enjoyed around the table or over the fire. The African braai plays a central role in the Sandveld experience — not as an event, but as a shared moment at the end of the day. Stories are told, the fire burns low, and the bush comes alive after sunset.

Food at Sandveld is about connection, not ceremony.





The Chalets

Your Private Space

Guests stay in private chalets, each set apart from the main lodge to offer space and privacy. The chalets are fully furnished and comfortable, with en-suite bathrooms and daily service. Designed as quiet retreats, they provide a place to rest, reset and prepare for the next day in the veld.

Travel Namibia

Good to Know

A few practical details to help you plan your time at Sandveld.

ENTRY

All visitors to Namibia must have a valid passport for at least six months after the date of entry. All visitors must also have a valid return ticket. In addition, all visitors must have a visa, except those nationalities with which Namibia has the necessary visa exemption agreement. Check with the Namibia Tourism Board website for visa waiver countries visitnamibia.com.na

BOOKING & CONFIRMATION

To confirm a booking with Sandveld Safaris, the following is required: full payment of the daily rates, a completed and signed Hunt Contract including agreed Terms & Conditions, as well as a copy of each hunter's and observer's passport. All bookings are confirmed at the prices valid at the time of booking.

PAYMENT

All payments are to be made by bank wire transfer. Cheques and traveller's cheques are not accepted. If travelling with USD cash, please ensure that all banknotes are new and in good condition, as Namibian banks do not accept older or damaged notes. All trophies remain the property of Sandveld Safaris until the full hunt balance has been settled.

REFUND & TRANSFER POLICY

All payments made to Sandveld Safaris are non-refundable under any circumstances. Payments may, however, be transferred to another date within the same season or to the following season, subject to availability and possible price adjustments.

PRICE

Prices are stated in United States Dollars (USD) and include the Namibian Government, Tax (VAT).

TAXIDERMY & TROPHY HANDLING

All trophies taken at Sandveld are carefully handled and prepared on site with great attention to detail. Proper capping and storage ensure trophies remain in excellent condition throughout the process. Trophy expediting is carried out by our long-standing partner Erongo Taxidermy, who manage all documentation, crating and delivery to the freight forwarder. Taxidermy can either be completed by Erongo or arranged with the taxidermist of your choice. Full expediting details are provided in your hunt information pack.

HUNTING SEASON

The hunting season in Namibia opens on February 1st and ends November 30th. Hunting permits are included in the Sandveld Price list.

FIREARMS

We discourage importing firearms for your hunt; this is possible but not worth the hassle. We have very good firearms and optics available at Sandveld for hire at a very reasonable rate for the duration of your hunt.

INSURANCE

Sandveld recommends customers invest in comprehensive travel insurance. Sandveld does not hold any insurance that will cover the loss or damage of your personal property at any time during your stay.

TRAVEL

Please book your flights to arrive in Windhoek - Hosea Kutako International Airport. THE DAY BEFORE YOUR HUNT STARTS. Stay the night in a hotel and we will collect you the following morning at 9am. This is the best way and eliminates any issues with delayed flights or late arrivals. If flying from the USA, we can recommend contacting the team at Esplanade Travel www.easplandetours.com a link can be found on the information tab on our website.

INCLUDED

All hunts are calculated on a per day basis. All accommodation and meals for the duration of your stay. The services of a professional hunting guide, field preparation, storage, and delivery to the expeditor of all trophies taken.

NOT INCLUDED

International or domestic Airline tickets to Namibia, or any associated travel costs. Hotel accommodation before or after your hunt. Sightseeing or further tourist activities. The use of company firearms and ammunition. Trophy expediting service costs, including freight and licence fees. Services of external operators for additional services such as touring.

NON-HUNTERS

Non-hunters are welcome to join the safari experience and enjoy the lodge, the landscape and time in camp while accompanying hunting guests.

ELECTRICITY

Namibia electricity is 220 volt at the outlet. You will need a plug adaptor. We have hair dryers in all our rooms. Virtually all camera/video/laptop/cell phone rechargers are 110-240 volt compatible.

LIABILITY

Your safety is our priority, Sandveld operates an accepted Health and Safety Management Plan. Sandveld conducts this hunting guiding business in an outdoor environment, many hazards exist, both natural and human made. By signing these terms and conditions as part of the hunt contract, you / your group, are confirming that Sandveld have made you / your group aware of the hazards / potential hazards, both natural and human made when involved in an outdoor hunting activity and you are agreeing to participate. It is the responsibility of the customer to notify Sandveld staff of medical conditions and / or physical limitations.

PHYSICAL ABILITY

Hunting at Sandveld is very achievable for all physical capabilities. Our properties are well tracked and have excellent 4x4 access. Please discuss your individual requirements with us prior to arrival so we can plan the most appropriate hunting experience.

GUIDES & TRACKERS

All hunts at Sandveld Safaris are conducted by licensed professional hunting guides and experienced Bushman trackers. Their deep knowledge of the land, wildlife and tracking forms an essential part of every hunt. JD holds a valid Professional Hunter licence, which is available for inspection at any time.
